#### *Focus*

### ESSENCE

By narrowing your scope of target and objective, you will succeed in achieving deep and lasting impact instead of wide-spread mediocrity.

### EXAMPLE

Many men and women fail to leave a legacy of effective influence because of their inability to concentrate their energies and talents into any specific area. The greatest figures of history share the trait of strategic focus; having defined their mission, they give themselves fully to the enterprise. Consider how this was true in the life of Jesus Christ:

1. He exhibited focus in His limited loyalties.  
*Luke 2:49*
2. He exhibited focus in His specific audience.  
*Matthew 15:21-28*  
*Luke 5:30-32*

3. He exhibited focus in His concise message.  
*Mark 1:15*

4. He exhibited focus in His finite time frame.  
*Luke 3:23*  
*Matthew 16:21*  
*John 17:1*

5. He exhibited focus in His protective detachment.  
*John 6:15*

6. He exhibited focus in His personal responsibility.  
*John 6:37-38*
