Reflections From the Top

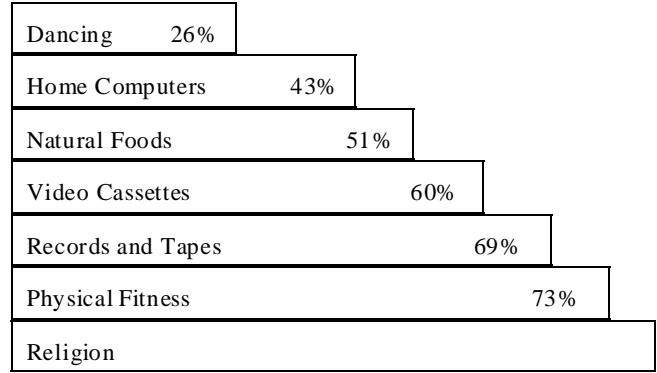
